

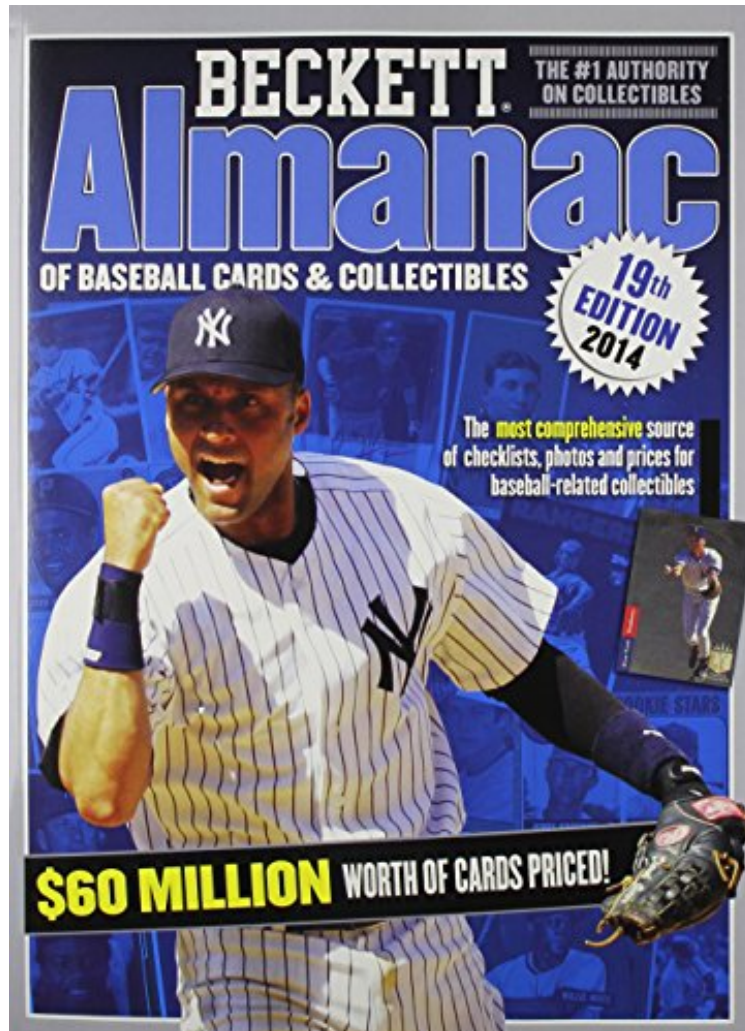

The Almanac is broken down into three sections. The bulk of it is dedicated to Major League baseball cards and section two is reserved for Minors/Draft Picks and the final and shortest section is reserved for Vintage Minor League. Gone is the major index section and is replaced with a semi watered down version. Also the decent size print is reduced to small print. I dont know how they

could have done it but it should have been sold as a two catalog set with bigger printing. Included this year are prices for baseball college cards.
