This, along with the companion book by Denys Brook-Hart (20th Century British Marine Painting) make an absolutely invaluable reference source for anyone interested in marine painting. I would also suggest adding the Dictionary of Sea Painters by E. H. H. Archibald to these for the ultimate reference library of marine painting! I was advised by the owner of a small art gallery to invest in these three books when I first became interested in this subject. After I got over the shock of the total outlay I followed her advice! As a result I have gained considerable pleasure from 'dipping and picking' as well as referring to the books for specific information on numerous occasions. This particular book has a very useful and informative series of chapters covering just about every topic or line of enquiry that is likely to be made on the subject of 19th century marine painting. This is followed by an extensive selection of monochrome plates giving artists' dates, their brief life histories and guiding assessments as to relative standing of the featured artist. There are a few colour plates to be found in the earlier part of the book. This book is especially valuable in my opinion both as an informative guide to marine painting and also as a reference book for identification of painters or paintings.
