However, there are two reasons I gave four stars instead of five. One is that the majority of captions identify an item using only generic words such as "canister set" and leave out the name of the manufacturer. For a book on collectibles, the biggest help to collectors would be in identifying the company that made an item, not just giving a generic description and a subjective price range. This is especially true for beginning collectors who are just learning the companies and the names of the product lines. The second reason for the four-star rating is that the photo on the cover shows kitchen items -- my area of interest that prompted the purchase of the book. However, the book includes a LOT of non-kitchen items, such as clocks, figurines, advertisements, tables, birdfeed, playing cards, toys, moth balls, baby planters,

greeting cards, wrapping paper, sewing patterns, children's books, candy boxes and wedding cake toppers. Whew! Bottom line: if you are looking for a book that is about kitchen collectibles and you want specific, detailed information on them, then be forewarned that you will have to wade through a great deal of other items, and you still won't end up knowing the manufacturers of most products. It's a beautiful book -- I just wish it was more like what it appeared to be from the cover and description. I would instead recommend "Spiffy Kitchen Collectibles" by Brian Alexander, if you want something that is full of detailed info on kitchen items from the 30s/40s/50s. EDITED TO ADD: Unfortunately, it is true that that binding is defective on this book, as other reviewers have noted. I read 100 pages, and each one fell out of the binding as I turned the page.
