

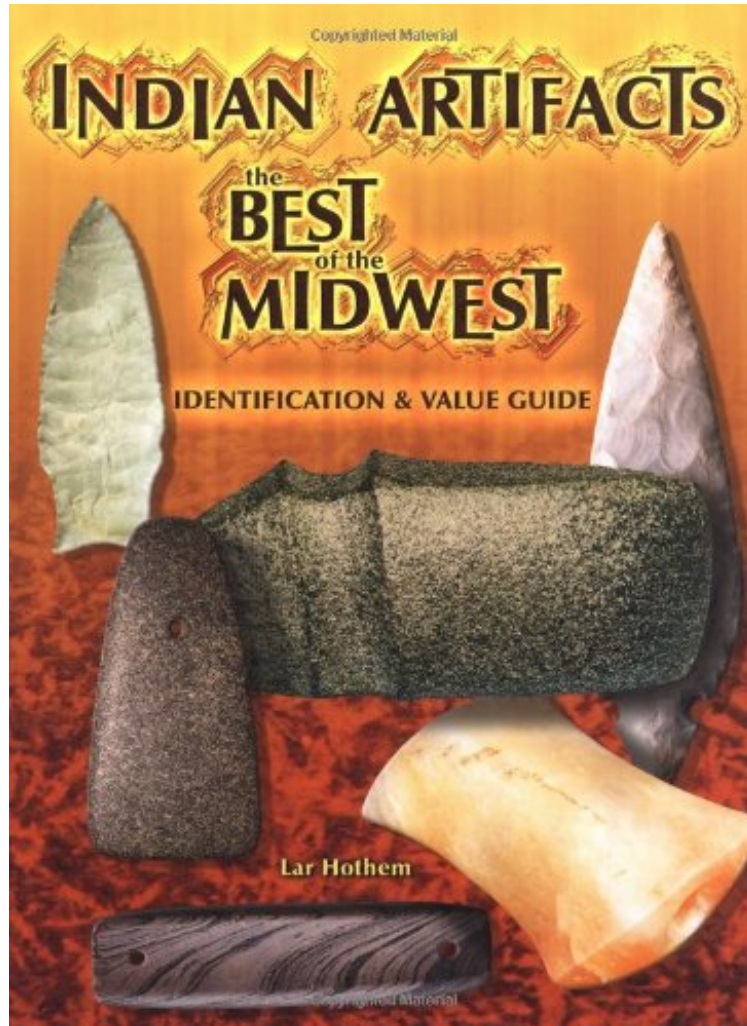

He authored over thirty books,brought color photography of artifacts to the forefront,and showed us great as well as average artifacts from some awesome collections. His love of and knowledge of ancient artifacts has seldom been equaled. We as collectors have lost one of the best and he will be greatly missed.

This book is spectacular, complete with nearly 2,300 color photographs. It showcases some of the finest collections of Midwestern artifacts from across the country, many of them never before published. Artifacts from all prehistoric periods are covered: Paleo, Mississippian, Archaic, and Woodland.
