

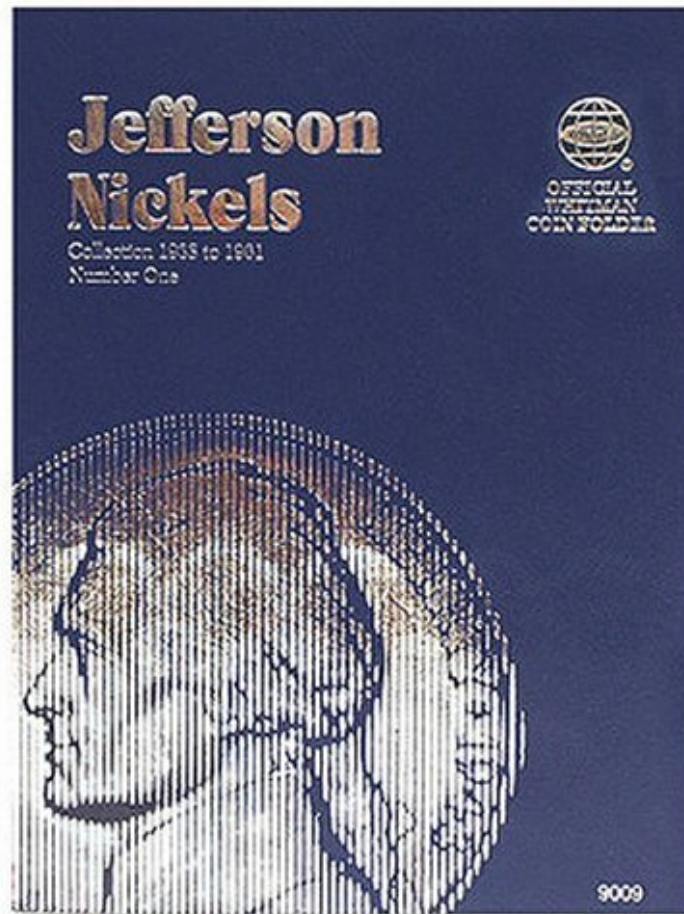

It's not often that I find an older nickel but when I do, it has a designated slot to call home.In this case, the user must be smarter than the product! Yes, the backing of the slots is flimsy so just insert the coin into the slot while the book rests on a hard surface like a kitchen counter or desk. DO NOT try an insert a coin on carpet or another 'cushy' surface - it will puncture the backing!
