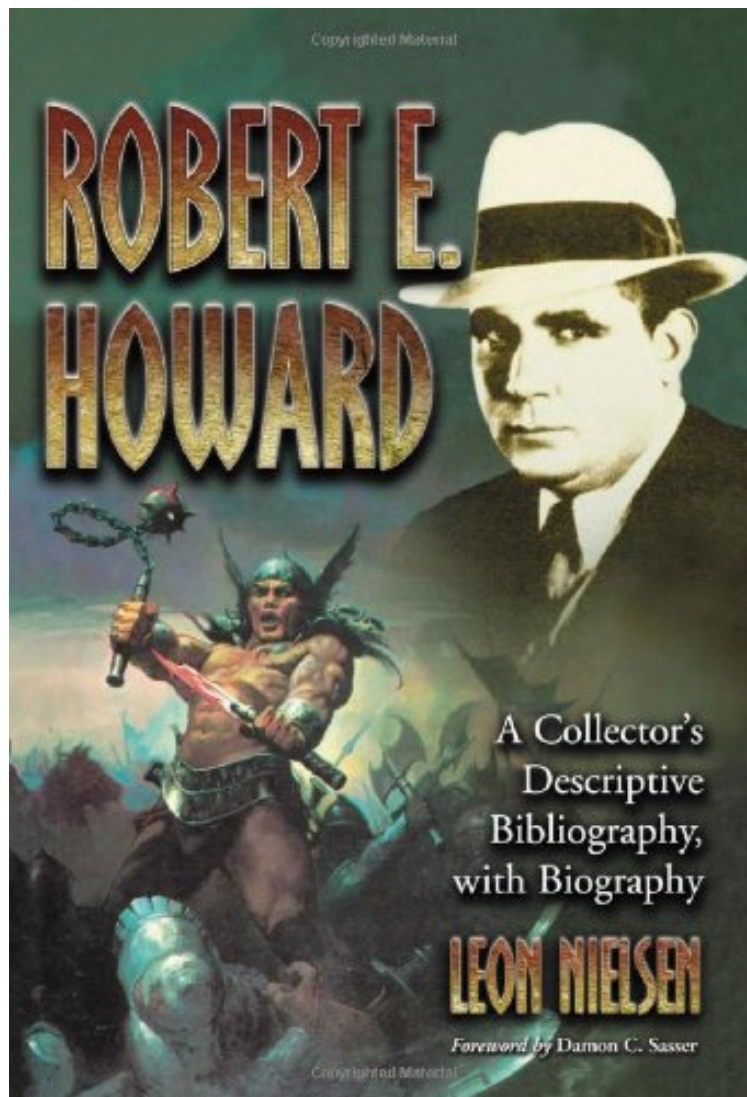

After a hiatus of 30 years or so, I was glad for the information I didn't know about. Edgar Rice Burroughs' Tarzan was my first initiation into the field of fantasy, and Robert Ervin Howard's Conan came later, but I would dearly hate to choose between them as both were dreamers, not just authors. I always think what the world may have been like if Robert E. Howard had lived, and the black hand of Fate did not come calling that very sad day in his life, but we will never know, and so, we are that much worse off. This book holds a wealth of information for the new collector as well as older ones. One of the chapters can be used for collecting anything not only Robert E. Howard. The 'Amateur Press Journals' and 'Books' sections was especially interesting to me as it brought back fond memories of some of the publishers I dealt with way back when, like: Glen Lord, George T. Hamilton, and especially Jonathan Bacon, Tim Underwood and artist Stephen Fabian. The last three men were exceptional, as they treated me with much kindness, and as a friend. The plates throughout the book are nicely copied, and very welcomed. I would gladly recommend this book to anyone with Robert E. Howard in mind, as it holds more than information on a dreamer's short life, but also about the characters he created and the many publications that have been dedicated to a man since his passing. Robert E. Howard published primarily in pulp magazines, creating memorable characters like Conan of Cimmeria. After his suicide at the age of 30, pulps continued publishing Howard material posthumously. His first hardcover book appeared in 1937, a year after his death. That book, *A Gent from Bear Creek*, is the holy grail for Howard collectors--only 12 original copies are known to exist. This invaluable resource for Howard collectors has information for every known published work. Initial chapters provide a biography, discuss Howard's literary legacy, and give basic tips about book collecting and selling. The main body of the work is a bibliography of Howard's published works from 1925 through 2005. A thorough index locates the publication of every Howard story or poem.
