

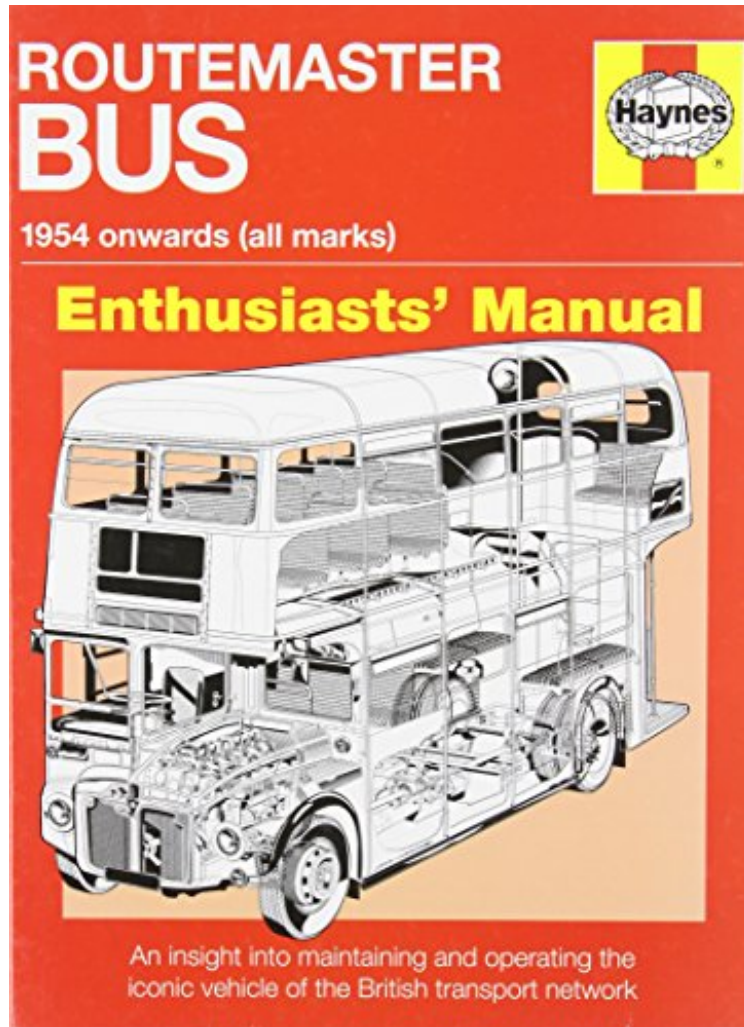

This book is filled with wonderful color photographs showing the inner workings of the Routemaster, buses undergoing restoration, and many of the interesting alternate liveries applied to these buses over the last 60 years. Although it will only appeal to a limited audience, as a fan of the Routemaster and Haynes' "workshop manual" series, this is one cool little book. The author is the Vice President of the Routemaster Association, and clearly knows

his stuff and loves these vehicles. Although it provides a decent history of the Routemaster and its variants, the amount of space devoted to describing the buses' construction, maintenance, and modern day restoration projects are what really make it stand out.
