The book offers the key to painted finishes and design motifs such as: marbled and distressed colour; layered, glazed colour; rustic grained finishes; and a range of applied decoration, from Rocco arabesques and floral pieces to the stylized brushwork used to build up traditional motifs.

From BooklistInnes turns her considerable talents to demonstrating Scandinavian painting. Each of the more than 20 projects is prefaced by a short narrative about the origins of the particular piece. Step-by-step textual guidance as well as color photographs provide even the novice painter with impossible-to-misconstrue instructions.
