By Redshirt with a rapier Reading the description of this book, you may think it's a semi-educational gallery of swords for your coffee table. It isn't. What it is is a bunch of photographs of modern reproductions. Not even a selection of the best ones, just the manufacturers with the biggest web presence: Albion, Arms Armor, Hanwei, Cold Steel, Darksword, Generation 2, and Valiant Armoury. Albion and AA are the semi-custom, expensive reproductions we all drool over online, and I won't rag on Cold Steel. The rest are the type to churn out cheap-looking Excalibur and Templar models. For your \$15, you will receive some of the same images of a small, unvaried sample of modern swords that you can find online printed on nice paper. Very clear, sharp pictures on a white background, this is an excellent resource for collectors, or those writing about such weapons. No extended description, just a label of what each is: Marshall Sword, Bushido Katana, Knecht MK II Germanic Sword.
