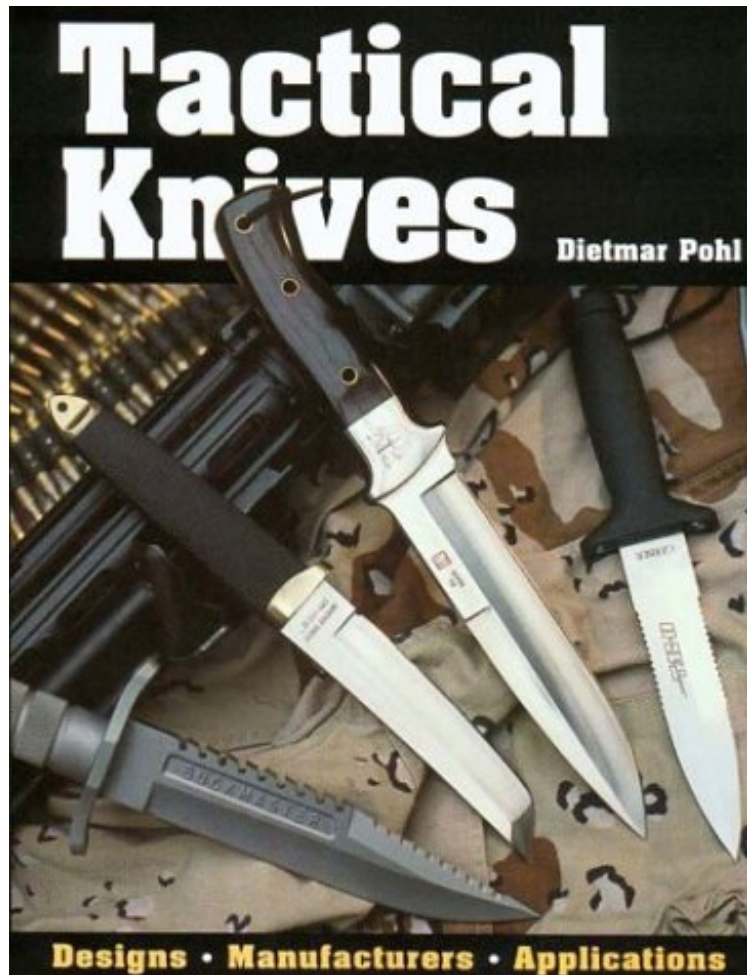

The author keeps things interesting by going into just enough detail without making it sound like a text book.There are a lot of clear color photos throughout the book.I've found that many "knife" books devote a majority of their content to custom knives while generally ignoring production brands.This book does the opposite- it touches on custom blades but usually discribes and shows knives from high-end production brands.I found the book to be way more interesting as well as educational because i was reading about knife models that I would actually buy (and use).If you are into expensive custom collector knives there are better books out there.
