

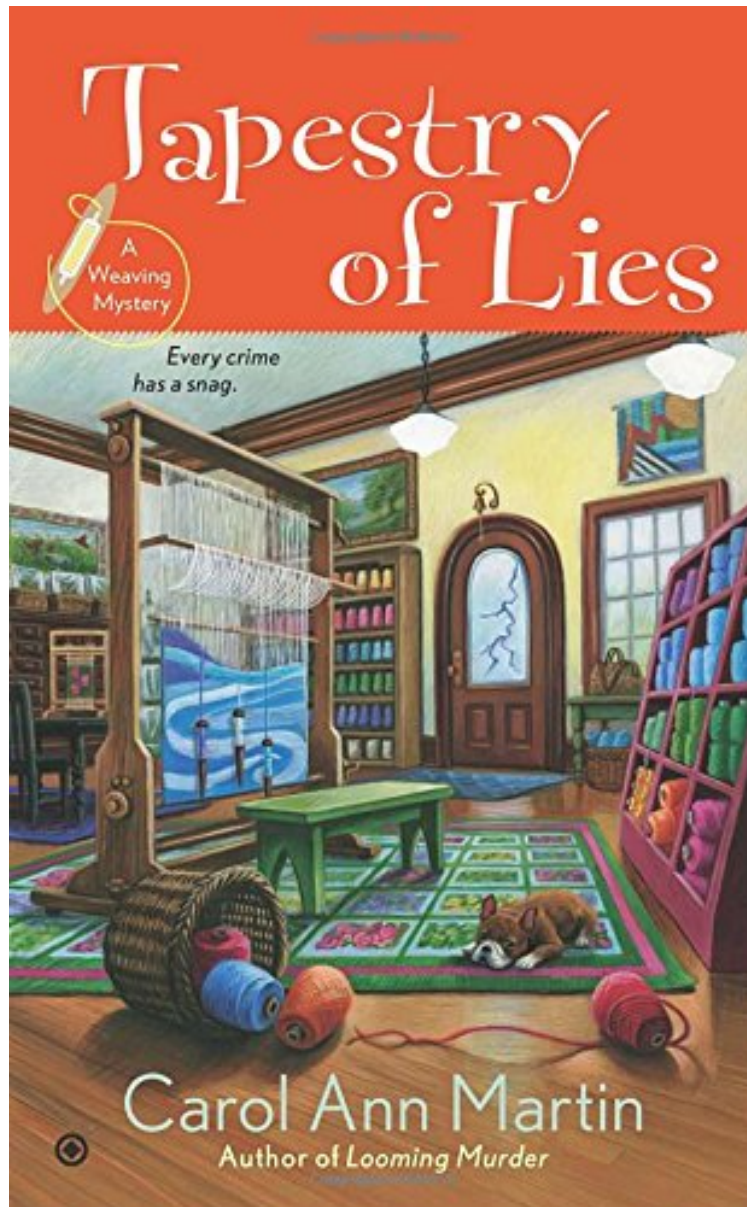

The detail about woven items and how they are made is nicely handled; there is just enough to satisfy the curious, but not too much for most readers. The characters are multi-dimensional, and the protagonist, Della Wright, has friends to support and encourage her. A budding romance with an old friend, Matthew, is moving so slowly that it's almost comical at times, but it's a pleasant change from some cozies in which a character falls in love within the first 5 pages. The English bulldog Winston is a good addition; his presence helps to bring his owner, Matthew, around to see Della more often, so that is certainly a plus. I read this installment before reading the first one in the series, but it didn't seem to matter. I plan to return and read the first one, since the series appears to hold promise, and the ending to this one was quite different than I had imagined. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
