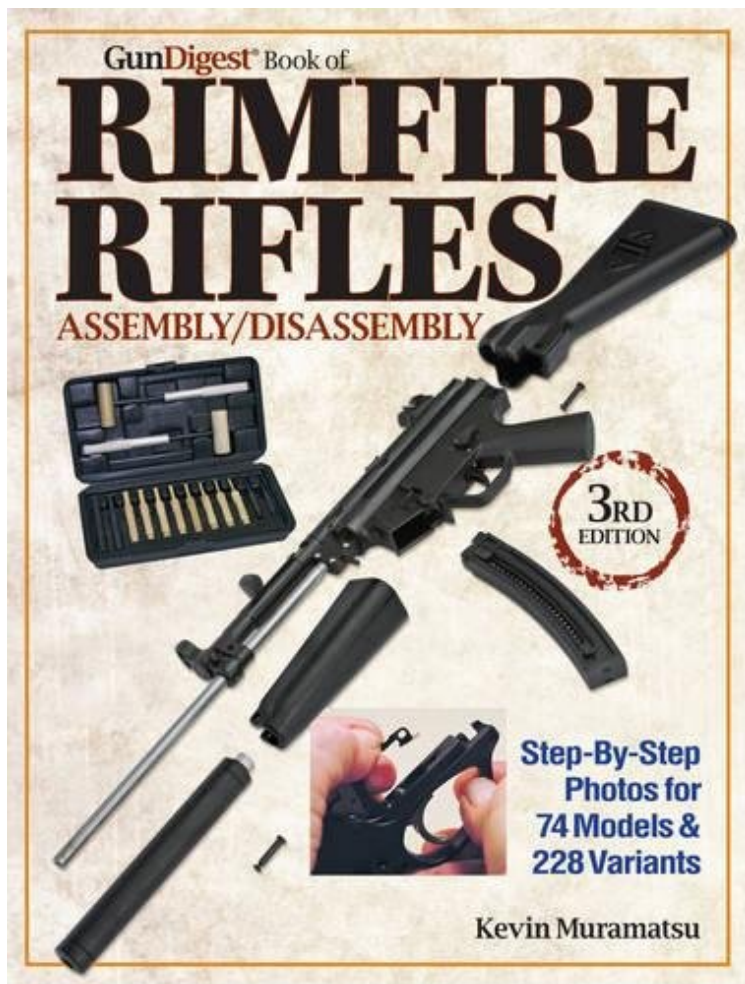

I got this to help decide if I should get the Browning T-bolt or a CZ 455. The T-bolt covered is the old one and it is NOT essentially the same as the new one (contrary to what the book says), and the CZ is not even mentioned. The only CZ covered is the 511, which was replaced by the 512 (totally different, and I know, because I own a 512). How can anyone do a book on rimfire rifles

and include only one CZ (and that one not in production)? The Ruger 77/22 write-up skips the only difficult part: removal and installation of the striker spring (the Ruger instruction manual does a better job on everything else). I would pass on this entire series until the publisher gets serious about production values (and checks the calendar to find out what year this is). 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. The book features a wide variety of 22RF rifles but unfortunately the title should have read: "North American Rimfire Rifles". Serious omissions include BSA (Birmingham Small Arms), Bruno, CZ, Anschutz, Walther, Sako etc. Very little, if any, of the European 22RF rifles are covered. Even the Savage Repeater and the common model M24 22/410 are omitted... I know the topic is wide and a comprehensive guide on the assembly and disassembly of 22RF rifles will certainly be double the size of the current edition. So, if you need information on North American manufacturers then yes buy this book.

I've used this book a few times since I bought it. I has a fairly good selection of fire arms covered. Many of the guns covered can be used for multiple models but you'll have to go to the index in the back to find all of the models covered. I would like to see this book offered in either hard spiral bound or a binder as it's hard to keep it open and work on a gun. The dismantling description are good but somewhat incomplete on some of the models. Overall I would recommend this book but I took away one star for the binding and the need for more/better details.
